About the OUF

The OUF began in 1997 as a way to help secondary school students gather information about Ontario's 21 universities. The OUF gives you an opportunity to speak with representatives from each Ontario university about programs, campus life and anything else that may help you make a decision about which Ontario university to choose.

The OUF is organized by a committee of the Ontario University Registrars' Association (OURA). This committee includes representatives from Ontario's universities, the Council of Ontario Universities (COU) and the Ontario Universities' Application Centre (OUAC).

Why Should You Come?

1. The OUF draws more than 130,000 students, parents and educators over the three-day event. Don't miss out on the largest educational fair in Canada!
2. You can talk personally with students, professors and senior university reps, get answers about programs, admission requirements, student life and much more.
3. Each university also offers a scheduled information session several times throughout the OUF weekend.

CONDITIONS OF ADMISSION AND PARTICIPATION

The OUF is sponsored by Ontario's 21 universities. The purpose of this very popular and well-attended event is to provide information about undergraduate programs, admissions requirements and university life. All visitors are welcome; there is no admission charge and no ticket is required. To ensure the safety and enjoyment of all guests, **the following rules will be in effect as conditions of admission to and participation in the Fair:**

All visitors are welcome at the OUF. No admission charge is required; however, to ensure the safety and enjoyment of all guests, the following rules apply as conditions of admission to, and participation in, the OUF:

- Prior to entry, all bags and knapsacks will be subject to inspection by security personnel, and all guests will be required to pass through a standard metal screening process.
- Certain articles will not be allowed into the OUF, including (but not limited to): items perceived as sharp (such as knives, razors, cork screws, picks, scissors, etc.), weapons of any kind (including toy replicas), glass, martial arts devices, illegal substances, alcoholic beverages, Kubaton key chains, aerosol sprays, flares, fire extinguishers and any other items deemed inappropriate by police and security services on duty.
- Visitors carrying inappropriate articles or any other item deemed disruptive to the event must return them to their vehicles or discard them in the bins provided at the entrance prior to entry.
- Visitors who do not agree to a bag inspection and screening process or who refuse to discard inappropriate items will not be allowed to enter the OUF.
- Visitors will be removed if they engage in any disruptive behaviour.
- Guests who appear to be under the influence of alcohol or drugs will be denied entry or will be required to leave the OUF.

Note: To speed entry into the OUF, we recommend that guests leave bags and knapsacks at home. A re-usable bag will be provided for the purpose of bringing home printed materials.

PLAN: QUESTIONS TO ASK

Here are some questions that will get you thinking about university and all of the things you should know before you make your decision. Take some time to sit down with your friends or family to review these questions in order to make the most of your visit to the Ontario Universities' Fair.

Ask yourself the following questions before you come to the Fair:

- What programs or courses interest me?
- Which subject(s) am I good at?
- How many years do I plan to be in university?
- How will I pay for university?
- How early should I start saving for university?
- Is living at home a possibility/preference?
- Can I afford to live away from home?
- Do I want to live away from home?
- Do I want to attend a small, medium or large university?
- Is the look and feel of the campus I choose important to me?

Admission Requirements:

- What courses are required in order to be admitted into the programs that interest me?
- Are there additional requirements for admission to the program I am interested in?
- Can I go right into education/professional program (e.g., law school, optometry) directly from secondary school?
- Do you accept courses that have been taken through night school, summer school and correspondence?

Program:

- What is an undergraduate degree?
- Does your university have the program that interests me?
- What is the difference between a professional program and a master's degree?
- Where can I get more information about a particular program?
- Can I look at your calendar or visit your website for more information?

Finances:

- What are the costs involved in attending your university for one year?
- Do you award scholarships automatically or do I need to apply?
- What are the criteria for your scholarships and when are the amounts determined?

Lifestyle:

- How do I apply for residence?
- Is residence guaranteed?
- What varsity sports are available?
- Can I still play sports if I'm not on a varsity team?
- What campus support services are offered, especially for new students?
- What are the first-year class sizes like at your university?
- Do class sizes vary according to the program I choose?


Next Step:

By Car If you are coming from west of Toronto, take Highway 401 East to Highway 427 South. Follow the Gardiner Expressway, exit at Spadina Avenue, and go north on Spadina. Turn right at Bremner Boulevard to reach the South Building.

If you are coming from east of Toronto, take Highway 401 West to the Don Valley Parkway south. Follow the Gardiner Expressway, exit at Spadina Avenue, and go north on Spadina. Turn right at Bremner Boulevard to reach the South Building. For the North Building, proceed further north on Spadina Avenue to Front Street and turn right.

By Train & Bus Union Station, the city's main rail station, is a block away, and is connected to the MTCC by the weather-protected Skywalk. The Front Street Bus Terminal is just five minutes away by cab or ten minutes away by public transit.

By Public Transit Streetcars, buses, subways and GO trains provide Toronto with one of North America's safest and most efficient public transit systems. The system connects all parts of Toronto and outlying areas to Union Station, the city's transportation hub. The MTCC is accessible from Union Station via the Skywalk, a weather-protected walkway.

South Building Parking Follow Bremner past the south entrance, turn right on Lower Simcoe Boulevard and then turn right into the south parking garage.
